From New York City's independent parks research and advocacy nonprofit, **Lucy Robson** and **Emily Walker** will present on successes, challenges, and next steps in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic.

New Yorkers for Parks has over 110 years of history advocating for parks and open spaces in NYC, with a recent focus on advocacy that is rooted in data-driven, quantitative research in conversation with constituent and grassroots feedback. Lucy will detail NY4P's bread-and-butter research work and projects, including the Open Space Index reports. Emily will describe the successful 2019 Play Fair campaign, which successfully advocated for an additional \$44M in the NYC Parks budget. She will present the challenges and opportunities posed by the pandemic for building on this campaign, and the imperative for investing public dollars in open spaces.
